

+Dear Friends,

"Ecce, Agnus Deil" What a grand and joyous celebration of our Catholic Faith draws us to Holy Mass this weekend! Today, we proclaim our faith and reverential awe for the "source and summit" of our Faith....CORPUS CHRISTI, the Sacred Body and Blood of Christ!

Allow me to share with you some thoughts of the late Pope Benedict XVI.

"The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is the solemn, public Feast of the Holy Eucharist, the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ: on this day, the Mystery instituted at the Last Supper and commemorated every year on Holy Thursday is manifested to all, in the midst of the fervor of faith and devotion of the Church."

"Indeed, the Eucharist is the "treasure" of the Church, the precious heritage that Her Lord has left to Her. And the Church preserves It with the greatest care, celebrating It daily in holy Mass, adoring It in churches and chapels, administering It to the sick, and as Viaticum to those who are on their last journey."

"The Eucharist *is* the Lord Jesus Who gives Himself "for the life of the world." In every time and place, He wants to meet human beings and bring them the life of God. The transformation of the bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood is in fact the principle of the divinization of creation itself."

"On this Feast day, the Church proclaims that the Eucharist is Its life, the source of life that triumphs over death. From communion with Christ in the Eucharist flows the charity that transforms our life and supports us all on our journey toward the heavenly homeland."

"Let us pray to the Virgin Mary, that all Christians may deepen their faith in the Eucharistic Mystery, to live in constant communion with Jesus and be His effective witness."

On this glorious Solemnity, I would encourage you to commit to some time of Eucharistic Adoration on most Wednesdays following the morning Mass. Consider offering this time to Jesus! *Pray about it.* Great things happen in parishes where our Lord is adored in Eucharistic prayer!

This great Solemnity this year has an added "bonus" you could say. On 1 June this year, the Archdiocese celebrates the Ordination of three new priests! What a glorious day on which to be Ordained. Let us pray for these new priests and also pray for a generous increase in vocations to the Holy Priesthood! It is also a bonus for myself. Thirty-nine years ago, on June 1st, I was Ordained. It seems like only yesterday in many ways. It is hard for me to believe how

quickly the years have passed. It almost seems impossible. And yet, here we are. I find it always a pleasure to help celebrate new Ordinations on my own anniversary. AD MULTOS ANNOS!!

As we worship and honor our Eucharistic Lord, let us pray for His divine mercy and grace to shower down upon our families, our parish and our hearts! To quote Saint Alphonsus Liguori:

"Frequent visits to Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Altar are a great help to the souls that love Him!"

And from St. Paul of the Cross:

"Visit the Blessed Sacrament often; there is your true life."

I ask that you all keep me in your prayers this next Friday as I have nasal/sinus surgery. I do not relish the idea of the surgery but it promises to enable me to breathe easier, sleep better and be a nicer person...well, maybe not the last one! There will be a visiting missionary priest here next weekend. I am also instructed to take things easy the following week, thus there will be no weekday Masses. I hope to be on duty for the following weekend Masses of June 15 & 16. Danke, Schoen!

We would like to talk to you about **Teams of Our Lady**. What is Teams of Our Lady? Teams of Our Lady is all about couples endeavoring to deepen their conjugal spirituality, live a Christ-centered family life, and to seek holiness through fully living the Sacrament of Marriage. Teams is not for marriages in trouble, Marriage Encounter, nor is it a Marian Movement per se; however, Mary is our Patroness, for she embodies the total and complete "Yes" to the Holy Spirit. Her prayer, the Magnificat, is our prayer at every meeting. That is where Teams come into play.
