

+Dear Friends,

The first woman, Eve, stands before God making excuses for why she gave fruit from the forbidden tree to Adam: "The serpent tricked me into it." The Evil One predominates as well in the minds of the scribes assembled where Jesus speaks to the crowds in parables: "He is possessed by Beelzebul. By the prince of demons, He drives out demons."

The New Eve, Mary, by her very presence is a kind of parable. Moved by the obedience of the Mother of God, the Son of God proclaims: "Who is My Mother? Whoever does the will of God."

Such obedience effects the ultimate driving out of Satan. "The One who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and place us with You in His Presence." ... a place far better than the Garden of Eden!

Last weekend was a glorious one! First, it was Corpus Christi. Second, it was my 39th anniversary of Ordination. Third, I was able to attend the First Mass of one of our newly ordained priests, Fr. Sam Rosko. The Mass was offered at Holy Rosary Church downtown, the Italian National Parish. That simply means that it was founded primarily as a local parish for all Italian immigrants in the early 20th century. No matter where they may have lived in the city of Indy, they could attend Holy Rosary and go to confession, carry on conversations, be counseled, and other things, all in Italian. It has recently been completely restored and it is glorious! It was the home parish of my pastor, Fr. Spicuzza.

Fr. Sam used a Mass setting called Mass of St. Nicholas by Hayden. It was magnificent. They had over thirty boys teenage and above, as servers and I would guess around the same number of we brother priests attended. Many of our thirty plus seminarians were in attendance. The choir was outstanding...sounded like professionals. Of course the organ and violins were out of this world as well. You know? They should be, for the Mass needs to carry us from earth to heaven!

As I prayed along and took part, my mind kept returning to my own First Mass, thirty nine years prior to the day. Naturally it was not of the same level of Fr. Sam's but it was beautiful. Fr. Spicuzza gave the homily. It was the church in which I was baptized, made First Communion and served. It still holds a special place for me whenever I get back to it.

It also was a time of reflection both on the Eucharist, as well as Priesthood. As I made mention on Sunday, I cannot think of anywhere else I would rather be than here at St. Mary to celebrate an anniversary of priesthood.

Now that we are into the month of June, let us enjoy the "lazy, crazy days of summer." How many remember that song? If you do, you are showing your age...like me. If you

do, you also remember: "the teeny, weeny, yellow polka-dot bikini." Summer is the time to enjoy, in a hopefully more laid back manner, the beauty and blessings of God's creation and blessings upon our parish and families.
