

I welcome you all to Mass this OKTOBERFEST WEEKEND! Today's readings are among the most challenging for people who live in a world and culture such as ours. In the Gospel the disciples are arguing with one another over which of them is the greatest; it shows just how human the Twelve were.

The Letter of St. James tells us that "where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice. That's pretty strong language.

In a culture that seems to value being "number one," these words cut to the heart. Jesus, in choosing to place a small child in the midst of His bickering disciples, is perhaps telling us that living a more simple life of trust in Him, is what is of true, lasting value.

These readings today are all about becoming good stewards of the gifts God so freely bestows on us. Each is different; each is valued. Maybe we could pray this coming week that we will be given the strength to embrace a life of grateful stewardship of our blessings.

One manner in which to show gratitude is how we treat our neighbor and what we can do to further life. Never be embarrassed to share the treasure that is our Catholic Faith! While called to strengthen life in this world, our most important call is to impart the knowledge of eternal life through Jesus Christ and His Church! We Catholics are far too timid in this endeavor. I believe we feel that we will come across as pushy or arrogant or some other such negative, when we invite and share our Catholic Faith with others. Far from it; it is the most important gift we can share with others! I think I mentioned a couple weeks ago that the overwhelming reason many converts to the Faith offer for exploring the Catholic Faith, is the simple example and invitation of a Catholic friend. That's very powerful my friends.

It seems that it is not fancy programs or elaborate strategies but a simple, authentic witness and living of one's Catholic beliefs. To discover truth and its eternal value, does not depend upon merely earthly means. Most importantly, it depends upon the grace of God. Let us truly be such authentic witnesses!

This coming week I will join with Fr. Jim for a bit of southern beach time. Fr. Simon, OP, or one of the other Dominicans from St. Paul's Newman Center at IU, will be with y'all next weekend. He enjoyed his last visit with the parish and I know he will again!
