+Dear Friends,

Most of us would regard good memory as a blessing. Good what? Oh, yeah, good memory! Yet a great Doctor of the Church, St. John of the Cross, warned that spiritual growth requires memory to be brought under strict control. Why?

For St. John of the Cross, an undisciplined memory churns up past sin, recalling the momentary enjoyment/ pleasure...and the lasting regret. So it was with the prophet Isaiah and St. Peter. Just when growth in the spiritual way beckons, sin rises from the dust of memory, points an accusing finger and asks, "Are you sure you desire to grow closer to God, with me in your baggage?"

When are we most likely to understand the full horror of our sins than when we truly appreciate the compassion and mercy of God? We overcome those sad memories when we have offended God through the virtue of hope, telling us to look not back, but forward to the life in and of Christ.

We cannot and should not forget our sinful past, but our past must be just that: past. I always remember former Archbishop Daniel saying: "We cannot hold ourselves prisoners to the past." Of course his point is the same as the Lord's; what is past is prologue, do not hold yourself in chains because of past, forgiven sins. In a ironic sense, to do so, is truly prideful. It is almost as if we are saying to Jesus, "I know You say I am forgiven, but I just won't believe it; I cannot accept it." Remembering what Jesus in effect told St. Peter: "Fear not the past. I have something better for you." Step out into the deep and trust in Christ. Now, that is a good memory to hold on to!

Consider joining me on a wonderful pilgrimage to Catholic sites in Switzerland, Germany and Austria! If enough folks sign up, I will lead a pilgrimage the middle of October for approximately 10 days. There is a complete itinerary on the bulletin board by my sacristy. Cost will include airfare and should be in the area of \$5,000 to \$5,500 per person. Think it over!
